District Governor pays official visit



25 F District Governor John Brown from Indianapolis spoke before members of the Centerville Lions Club Monday evening, March 28, at its regular dinner meeting in the Senior Center. 15 members and guests were present.

Governor Brown stated that the Lions Clubs were formed in 1917 by Melvin Jones and will celebrate 100 years next year. District 25-F has 64 clubs and over 1700 Lions club members in central and eastern Indiana. He also told of the LCIF program of Lions International in helping others and the Dictionary Project for third graders in the district. The Kid's Sight project is also a new program for the Lions. A new trustee is needed for Camp Woodsmoke too.

Governor's Night had been originally planned for March 14.
