Lion Tim McConaha Dies At Age 69 Served As President Twice

Lion Timothy (Tim) O. McConaha of Centerville has died at the age of 69. From a long line of McConaha's, he lived on a farm that has been in his family for over 150 years. He died Friday, March 12, at IU Health Ball Memorial Hospital in Muncie, surrounded by his wife and children.

Born in Richmond, he graduated from Centerville High School in 1970. He retired in 2004 after 29 years with UPS. He was a lifetime farmer.

He was active in the Centerville, Indiana Lions Club, having served as its president in 2006-2007 and again in 2016-17. He was also chair of the Broom Sales fund raiser and had served on numerous project committees.

Survivors included his wife of nearly 47 years, Wanda; three children and several grandchildren.
