Annual Lions Steak Fry Held at Mansion House



Medium rare to well done steaks grilled by Lion Joe Elstro were enjoyed by 11 Lions and 5 guests at the group's annual steak fry Monday evening September 14th at the Mansion House. His mother, Marie Elstro, prepared the food for the event. His dad, Lion Paul Elstro, brought the grills to the site among other things.

Lion first vice president Scott Bevington filled in for speaker Kyle Davern, the community liaison for the Alzheimer Association, who could not attend due to Covid-19 restrictions. Lion Scott, who is the group's volunteer ambassador for the 6th Congressional District, urged members to participate in the Alzheimer's Walk to raise funds and awareness on Saturday, September 19. Bevington said the walk was being done virtually this year due to the pandemic. He said there are some 110,000 persons in Indiana with Alzheimer's with 330,000 caregivers. He said the organization is working on legislation co-sponsored by 6th District Congressman Greg Pence to secure more funds for an educational program to make the medical community more aware of problems associated with the disease. He said he became involved with the organization after his grandmother died with Alzheimer's.

Lion president Holly Stiggleman told Lions the Leo club now has twenty members and recently held a Rock-A-Thon and plan to donate some of the funds to the Lions Club for the dictionary program for elementary students.

She also urged members to assist with the fundraisers sponsored by the Liberty Lions Club at Warm Glow Candles on September 26 and 27 and the drags at the fairgrounds in Brookville on October 9 and 10th. Funds raised will be shared equally between the two clubs.
